Acts 1:6-8

"When they were together for the last time they asked, 'Master, are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel now? Is this the time?' He told them, 'You don't get to know the time. Timing is the Fathers's business. What you'll get is the Holy Spirit. And when the Holy Spirit comes on you, you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, all over Judea and Samaria, even to the ends of the world." [The Message translation].

So....after all the excitement and celebration of Resurrection Sunday two weeks ago, what we may be left with are QUESTIONS! Like Seniors who are about to graduate we know that there is something next, eg, work, college, military, travel, but we don't really know how DIFFERENT it all will be from what we have known! It is great in the moment but what about the NEXT moments?

The disciples were with Jesus after his Resurrection and after the whirl and stir of knowing the Master was not dead, they get back to asking The Teacher questions.

Jesus says that some things are left strictly to God's timing. Some things are not going to be answerable to our satisfaction. God is God and we are not!

What Jesus does say is that 1) we will get help on what's next through the Holy Spirit and 2) we will get to witness ("be at work for God") just about everywhere around the world. That includes your next door neighbor and local community of course! And with people you are yet to know! The early disciples sure enough did get busy! We can read about that in the New Testament.

We are disciples too! Greater things lie ahead for the mission of Kedron UMC.

How great to know a God who loves me, even when I appear with two left feet! How refreshing to know that I do not have to appear before my Maker in perfected dress and impeccable good order! I am received, affirmed, and welcomed because I am God's creation. I hold membership in a noble spiritual family. The klutzy clumsiness of my endeavors are never maligned. God asks me to strive for greater obedience precisely because I am greatly loved.

I will undoubtedly forget something else another travel time: a belt, a matching tie, even a suit. But I will always know that God is not embarrassed or put off by my human limitations. In fact, God probably loves me best when I stand utterly shoeless in the Holy Presence!


