#### From Our Pastor

"Don't be deceived, my dear brothers and sisters. Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows." James 1:16,17

And most anyone can come up with a Top Ten list of illnesses or injuries to avoid or not repeat again ("don't get on that ladder again Grandpa!").

Pastor?! Have you forgotten where you started? What about the good things?! I simply wanted to illustrate what tends to get our attention! And what we may take for granted, because for the person of faith, life is ultimately a blessing although it will have its moments, to be sure, of "curses." 
